In April 1999 David Copeland targeted the Black, Asian and Gay communities of Brixton, Brick Lane and Soho because he wanted to create a climate of fear that would divide our communities, ignite racial tensions and lead to the election of the BNP - luckily he failed but not before he had killed three people and injured many more.

In September 2009 Ian Baynham and his friend were out celebrating in central London, as they walked through Trafalgar Square they were homophobically abused. When Ian challenged this behaviour he was knocked to the ground and beaten, later dying from the injuries he sustained.

17-24-30 was originally established to help organise and facilitate the April acts of remembrance in Brixton, Brick Lane and Soho each year but when Ian died his friends turned to us for help and two weeks later we organised the first Vigil against Hate Crime in Trafalgar Square.

10,000 people joined us in central London to state that hate crime in all its forms is not acceptable in our communities. with messages of support from around the world. We aim to make this an annual gathering to say **No to Hate Crime**.

**NO TO HATE CRIME**



Founded in April 2009 to mark the 10th Anniversary of the London Nail Bomb attacks on Brixton, Brick Lane and Soho we are a small charity run entirely by volunteers..

Our purpose is to encourage communities to work together to tackle hate crime in all its forms.

Our main aims are :-

- To bring people together
- To remember those we have lost
- To support those affected by hate crime
- To build our communities .

We want to establish an annual International Day of Hope and Remembrance to encourage all communities to stand together and make it clear that Hate Crime is not acceptable.

To achieve these aims we will do the following :-

- April Acts of Remembrance
- London Vigil against Hate Crime
- Networking – local, regional, national and international
- Encourage other areas to hold vigils
- International day of Hope and Remembrance
- Roll call of names
- 2 minute silence
- Sign-posting work “in their names”
- Sign-posting support services
- Supporting survivor networks
- Training Opportunities
- Education Projects
- Develop volunteer strategy
- Create materials/resources
- Purchase equipment and resources
- Establish equipment loan system to support other community events.

And other projects as yet unidentified.
